Reading: Reading is practised daily in our phonics sessions and throughout the day. We love reading in 1E! We have a daily story time and children are encouraged to read in the class book corner. We will also be having weekly visits to the school library.

Writing: Our writing is linked to our focus texts. This term we will be writing labels and captions, informal letters, posters, glossaries and fact files.
